



battery

conserve battery charge

Using certain features can quickly deplete your battery's charge. These features can include downloading music, replaying videos, and using Bluetooth® wireless connections.

You can conserve your battery's charge by doing the following:

 Turn Bluetooth power off when not in use (see page 107).

- Turn off wallpaper (see page 33).
- Reduce backlight display time (see page 34).

install battery & memory card

1 Rotate the locking screw a half turn to the right.



2 Lift the bottom end of the cover, then pull the cover down and off the phone



3 Insert the optional microSD card



With the gold contacts facing down and at the lower end of the battery, insert the battery, lower end first, and push it completely into place.



5 Lower the top end of the battery cover onto the phone, then snap the cover into place.



Note: Press down on the entire perimeter of the battery door to ensure its water seal.

6 Rotate the locking screw a half turn to the left to lock the cover.



charge the battery

New batteries are not fully charged. Before you can use your phone, you need to install and charge the battery. Some batteries perform best after several full charge/discharge cycles.

To charge using the charger:

- Connect the USB cable end adapter to the Wall/USB charger power head.
- Lift up the micro USB port cover on the phone and insert the adapter cable.



- Connect the Wall/USB charger head to an AC wall outlet.
- Disconnect the Wall/USB charger from the phone and AC outlet when your phone displays Charge Complete.

Tip: Motorola batteries have circuitry that protects the battery from damage from overcharging.

When you charge the battery, the battery level indicator at the upper right of the screen shows charging progress. At least one segment of the indicator must be visible to ensure full phone functionality while charging.

To charge from your computer:



You can also charge your phone's battery by connecting a cable from your phone's micro USB port to a high-power USB connector on a computer (not a low-power one, such as the USB connector on your keyboard or bus-powered USB hub). Typically, USB high-power connectors are located directly on your computer.

Both your phone and your computer must be turned on, and you must have correct software drivers installed on your computer. Cables and software drivers are available in Motorola Original $^{\text{m}}$ data kits, sold separately.

turn it on & off

The phone may require several seconds to turn on. If prompted, use the keypad to enter your four-digit unlock code (which, by default, is the last four digits of your phone number) and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K) to unlock the phone.

To turn on your phone, press and hold the Power/End Key (=) until the display turns on.



To turn off your phone, press and hold the Power/End Key (<u></u>).

make a call

Note: To make a Push to Talk calls, see page 56.

Enter a phone number, Area Code first, if applicable, and press the Send Key ((See) to make a call.



To make a call outside the U.S.A., press and hold with the until you see +. Next, press the number keys to dial the country code and phone number, then press the Send Key (......)

answer a call

Note: To answer Push to Talk calls, see page 59.

When your phone rings and/or vibrates, press the Send Key () to answer.

Tip: You can set the phone to answer calls when you open the flip (see page 32).

end a call

To hang up, press the Power/End Key ().

You can also end a call by closing the flip, **if you are not connected to a headset or a handsfree car kit**.

Closing the flip does not end the following:

- a data connection using a USB cable to connect the phone to a computer
- a Push to Talk call
- active VCAST download sessions, such as downloading music or ringtones

store a phone number

- 1 From the main screen, use the keypad to enter a phone number and press the Left Soft Key (Save).
- 2 Select Add New Contact by pressing the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 3 Use the Directional Key () to scroll to an entry type and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).

4 Use the keypad to enter a name and other details for the phone number and press the center of the Directional Key ((Save) to store the number.

To edit or delete a Contacts entry, see page 92.

call a stored phone number

- 1 From the main screen, press the Right Soft Key (Contacts) to open the CONTACT LIST.
- 2 Scroll to the Contacts entry.
 - If the entry has more than one phone number, press right or left on the Directional Key () to toggle between the numbers.
- Press the Send Key (SEND) to call the entry.

phone submersion

Your phone may be submerged for up to thirty minutes in up to one meter of water, if you do the following:

- Ensure that the battery door is properly installed and locked (see "install battery & memory card" on page 10).
- Securely close the covers for the Micro USB Port and the 2.5mm Headphone Port (see page 3).

basics

See page 2 for a basic phone diagram.

home screen

You see the *home screen* when you turn on the phone or when you press the Power/End Key ().

Tip: You can quickly select a menu option by pressing the number for that option. For example, from the SETTINGS & TOOLS menu, press 5 to select Display Settings.

From the main screen, you can press up, down, left, or right on the Directional Key () to open shortcuts:

Note: These are the default main screen shortcuts. To customize these shortcuts, see page 38.

You can set your phone to display or hide these menu icons on the main screen (see page 38).

Your phone displays system status indicators at the top of the screen. To find what these indicators mean:

- 1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the Directional Key () to scroll to
 Settings & Tools and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).

- 3 Scroll to Phone Info and press the center of the Directional Key (() (OK).
- 4 Scroll to Icon Glossary and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 5 Select the indicator type and press the center of the Directional Key (() (OK).

adjust volume

Press the Volume Keys to do the following:

- turn off an incoming call alert
- change the earpiece volume during calls
- change the ringer volume from the main screen (see page 16)

change sound settings

Press the Volume Keys up or down to select a MASTER VOLUME setting: High, Medium High, Medium, Medium Low, Low, Vibrate Only, Alarm Only, and All Sounds Off (see page 28).

handsfree

Note: The use of wireless phones while driving may cause distraction. Discontinue a call if you can't concentrate on driving. Additionally, the use of wireless devices and their accessories may be prohibited or restricted in certain areas. Always obey the laws and regulations on the use of these products.

handsfree speaker

You can use your phone's handsfree speaker to make calls without holding the phone to your ear.

To activate the handsfree speaker during a call, press and hold the Smart/Speakerphone Key (on the right side of the phone—see page 3).

Your phone will show the speakerphone indicator sand SPEAKER PHONE ON on the main screen.

The handsfree speaker stays on until you press and hold the Smart/Speakerphone Key again or turn off the phone.

To turn off the handsfree speaker, press and hold the Smart/Speakerphone Key. Your phone will show SPEAKER PHONE OFF on the main screen.

To end the call, press the Power/End Key ((=)). You will hear an audible alert.

Note: The handsfree speaker won't work when your phone is connected to a handsfree car kit or headset.

accessory volume settings (car kit or headset)



To adjust volume of headsets or car kit accessories that are enabled for Bluetooth wireless connections, press your phone's Volume Keys up or down during an active call.

airplane mode


Note: Consult airline staff about the use of **Airplane Mode** in flight. Turn off your phone whenever instructed to do so by airline staff.

- 1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the Directional Key () to scroll to
 Settings & Tools and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center of the Directional Key ((OK).

- 4 Press center of the Directional Key (() (OK) to select Airplane Mode.
- 5 Select On and press the center of the Directional Key (() (OK).

Use airplane mode to turn off your phone's calling features in locations where wireless phone use is prohibited. You cannot make or receive calls or use Bluetooth in airplane mode, but you can use your phone's other non-calling features.

When Airplane Mode is set to On, your phone displays indicators and a message on the main screen:



change lock code

Your phone's four-digit **lock code** is originally set to the last four digits of your phone number. To change the lock code:

- 1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the Directional Key () to scroll to Settings & Tools and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center of the Directional Key (() (OK).
- 4 Scroll to **Security** and press the center of the Directional Key ((a)) (OK).
- When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 6 Scroll to Edit Codes and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).

- 7 Scroll to Phone Only and press the center of the Directional Key ((OK).
- 8 Enter the new four-digit lock code in the Enter New Code entry area, then press down on the Directional Key () to move the cursor into the Re-Enter New Code entry area. Re-enter the new four-digit lock code.
- 9 Press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).

lock & unlock phone

You can lock your phone to keep others from using it. To lock or unlock your phone, you need the four-digit lock code (which is originally set to the last four digits of your phone number).

Note: You can make emergency calls on a locked phone (see page 44). A locked phone still rings or vibrates for incoming calls or messages.

manual lock

To manually lock your phone:

- 1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the Directional Key () to scroll to Settings & Tools and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center of the Directional Key (((OK)).
- 4 Scroll to **Security** and press the center of the Directional Key ((a)) (**OK**).
- When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).
- 6 Scroll to Lock Phone Now and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).

To **unlock** the phone from the home screen, press the Right Soft Key (**Unlock**), enter the four-digit lock code, and press the center of the Directional Key (**((()()** (**0K**).

automatic lock

To **automatically lock** your phone whenever you turn it off:

- 1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the Directional Key () to scroll to Settings & Tools and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center of the Directional Key (((OK)).
- 4 Scroll to **Security** and press the center of the Directional Key (**(()**) (**0K**).
- When prompted, enter the lock code and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).

- **6** Scroll to **Phone Lock Setting** and press the center of the Directional Key (**(**) (**OK**).
- 7 Scroll to On Power Up and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 8 Press the Power/End Key (=>) to return to the main screen.

To **unlock** the phone, enter the four-digit lock code in the **Enter Lock Code** entry area and press the center of the Directional Key (\bigcirc) (**OK**).

lock side keys when flip is closed

When the phone's flip is closed, you can lock the side keys to prevent accidental key presses.

To set the side keys to **lock automatically** when you close the flip:

- 1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key (((MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the Directional Key () to scroll to Settings & Tools and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).
- 3 Scroll to Phone Settings and press the center of the Directional Key ((OK).
- Scroll to External Key Lock and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).
- 5 Select the number of seconds the phone waits after you close the flip to lock the side keys: Always Off, 7 Seconds, 15 Seconds, or 30 Seconds.
- **6** Press the Power/End Key () to return to the main screen.

To unlock the side keys when the flip is closed, open the flip.

To manually lock the side keys, press and hold the smart/speakerphone key on the right side of the phone

(see page 3). To unlock the side keys, press and hold the smart/speakerphone key again, or open the flip.

manage memory



Note: The microSD memory card is an **optional accessory**, available separately.

You can store multimedia content such as songs and photos on your phone's internal memory or on a removable microSD memory card.

Note: If you download a copyrighted file to your phone and store it on your memory card, you can use the file only when your memory card is inserted in your phone. You cannot send, copy, or change copyrighted files.

set memory for multimedia content

You can download and store multimedia content in phone memory or on the memory card:

- 1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the Directional Key () to scroll to Settings & Tools and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 3 Scroll to Memory and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- Scroll to Save Options and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 5 Scroll to Pictures, Videos, or Sounds, and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 6 Select Phone Memory or Card Memory and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).

view memory information

1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.

- 2 Use the Directional Key (♠) to scroll to ♠ Settings & Tools and press the center of the Directional Key (♠) (OK).
 - Scroll to Memory and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).
- 4 Select Phone Memory or Card Memory and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).
- 5 Select My Pictures, My Videos, My Ringtones, My Music, My Sounds, or My Contacts, and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).

If you selected **Phone Memory** in step 4, you will also see **Phone Memory Usage** and **Move All To Card**. If you selected **Card Memory** in step 4, you will also see **Card Memory Usage**, **Move All To Phone**, and **Format Card**.

move files from phone to memory card

You can move files (such as photos, videos, sound, and music files) to the memory card to free up phone memory.

Note: Moving a file to the memory card deletes it from phone memory.

To move photos or videos:

- 1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the center of the Directional Key (♠) (OK) to select ❤ Media Center.
- 3 Scroll to Picture & Video and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 4 Open My Pictures or My Videos.

A memory card icon **M** in the picture thumbnail or next to a video file indicates that the file is stored on the memory card.

A lock icon **a** in the picture thumbnail indicates that the **picture came preloaded on your phone** and cannot be moved to the memory card.

If the picture or video is not marked with a memory card icon, it is stored on the phone.

- 5 Scroll to the thumbnail of the picture or video you want to move and press the Right Soft Key (Options).
- 6 Select Move and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 7 When the phone asks if you want to move the file, select Yes and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K) to confirm that you want to move the file.

To move an audio clip that you recorded:

- 1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Press the center of the Directional Key () (0K) to select Media Center.
- 3 Scroll to Music & Tones and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 4 Use the Directional Key () to scroll to My Sounds and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).

A memory card icon 🛍 beside the file name of an audio clip indicates that the audio clip is stored on the memory card.

If the file name is not marked with a memory card icon, the audio clip is stored on the phone.

A lock icon **a** indicates that the **audio clip came** preloaded on your phone and cannot be moved to the memory card.

- 5 Scroll to the file you want to move and press the Right Soft Key (Options).
- 6 Select Move and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).
- 7 When your phone asks if you want to move the file, select Yes and press the center of the Directional Key (() (0K) to confirm that you want to move the file.

TTY operation

You can use an optional teletypewriter (TTY) device with your phone to send and receive calls. You must plug the TTY device into the phone's headset connector and set the phone to operate in one of three TTY modes.

Notes:

 A TTY is a communication device used by people who are hard of hearing or have a

- speech impairment. TTY does not work from mobile phone to mobile phone.
- Use a TSB-121 compliant cable (provided by the TTY manufacturer) to connect the TTY device to your phone. Your phone has a 2.5mm jack.
- Set the phone to Medium volume level for proper operation. If you experience a high number of incorrect characters, adjust the volume as needed to minimize the error rate.
- For optimal performance, your phone should be at least 12 inches (30 centimeters) from the TTY device. Placing the phone too close to the TTY device may cause high error rates.

set TTY mode

1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.

- 2 Use the Directional Key (♠) to scroll to ♠ Settings & Tools and press the center of the Directional Key (♠) (OK).
- 3 Scroll to Call Settings and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).
- Select TTY Mode and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).

When you set your phone to a TTY mode, it operates in that mode whenever a TTY device is connected.

TTY Mode can include these options:

options	
TTY Full	Transmit and receive TTY characters.
TTY + Talk (VCO)	Receive TTY characters but transmit by speaking into microphone.
TTY + Hear (HCO)	Transmit TTY characters but receive by listening to earpiece.

options	
TTY Off	All TTY modes are turned off.

When your phone is in a TTY mode, your phone displays the international TTY mode, the international TTY symbol, and the mode setting during an active TTY call.

return to voice mode

To return to standard voice mode, select **TTY OFF** from the **TTY MODE** menu.

voice privacy

Encrypt outgoing voice calls and use secure channels when available:

1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.

- 2 Use the Directional Key (♠) to scroll to ♠ Settings & Tools and press the center of the Directional Key (♠) (OK).
- 3 Scroll to Call Settings and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 4 Scroll to Voice Privacy and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).
- 5 Select **0n** and press the center of the Directional Key (**()** (**0K**).

tips & tricks

From the main screen (page 15), you can use shortcuts:

То	
lock side keys	With the flip closed, press and hold the Smart/Speakerphone Key (see page 3).
turn handsfree speaker on/off	With the flip open, press and hold the Smart/Speakerphone Key (see page 3).
see recent calls	Press the Send Key (@). Your phone shows all recent dialed, received, and missed calls.
call voicemail	Press and hold 1.
change ring volume	Press the Volume Keys up or down (see page 3).

use voice commands	With the flip open, press the Voice Command Key (see page 3). Then use the on-screen prompts.
record voice records	Press and hold the Voice Command Key (see page 3).

personalize

sounds

You can set how your phone alerts you to incoming calls or other events.

master volume

From the home screen, press the Volume Keys (see page 3) up or down to select a MASTER VOLUME setting:

High, Medium High, Medium, Medium Low, Low—Phone rings for incoming calls and other events, depending on the detail settings.

Vibrate Only—Phone vibrates to indicate an incoming call.

Alam Only—Phone plays an audible alarm to alert you to events. You can't change detail settings for events.

All Sounds Off—Phone does not alert you to incoming calls and events.

sounds for calls, events, & alerts

Note: MASTER VOLUME must be set to High, Medium High, Medium, Medium Low, or Low.

To set sounds for calls:

- 1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the Directional Key (♠) to scroll to ♠ Settings & Tools and press the center of the Directional Key (♠) (OK).
- 3 Scroll to Sounds Settings and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 4 Select Call Sounds and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).

5 From the CALL SOUNDS menu, select Call Ringtone by pressing the center of the Directional Key () (0K), then scroll to a desired ringtone and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).

Note: Press the Left Soft Key (**Play**) to preview the ringtone.

or

From the CALL SOUNDS menu, scroll to Call Vibrate and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K), then scroll to 0n or Off and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).

6 Press the Power/End Key (=) to return to the main screen.

To set sounds for **events (such as incoming messages) or alerts**:

1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.

- 2 Use the Directional Key () to scroll to Settings & Tools and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- 3 Scroll to Sound Settings and press the center of the Directional Key () (OK).
- Select Alert Sounds and press the center of the Directional Key (() (OK).
- 5 Scroll to TXT Message, Pic/Video/Voice Message, Voicemail, Emergency Tone, Missed Call, Low Battery, or PTT Alert, and press the center of the Directional Key ((**)) (0K).
- 6 Scroll to Tone and press the center of the Directional Key (♠) (OK), then scroll to a desired ringtone and press the center of the Directional Key (♠) (OK).

Note: Press the Left Soft Key (**Play**) to preview the ringtone.

automatic redial



When you receive a busy signal, your phone displays Call Failed, Number Busy.

With automatic redial, your phone automatically redials the number for one minute. When the call goes through, your phone rings or vibrates once, displays Redial Successful, and connects the call.

You need to turn on automatic redial to use the feature:

- 1 From the main screen, press the center of the Directional Key () (MENU) to open the menu.
- 2 Use the Directional Key () to scroll to Settings & Tools and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).

recent calls

Your phone keeps lists of the calls you have received and dialed, even if the calls didn't connect. The most recent calls are listed first. The oldest calls are deleted as new calls are added.

emergency calls

Your service provider programs one or more emergency phone numbers, such as 911, that you can call at any time, **even when your phone is locked**.

Note: Check with your service provider, as emergency numbers vary by country. Your phone may not work in all locations, and sometimes an emergency call cannot be placed due to network, environmental, or interference issues. Do not solely rely on your wireless phone for essential communications such as medical emergencies.

To make an emergency call: Turn your phone on, exit any open application such as games, dial the emergency number, then press the Send Key (co) to call the emergency number.

international calls

If your phone service includes international dialing, press and hold $\textcircled{\bigstar}$ to insert your local international access code (indicated by +). Then, use the keypad to dial the country code and phone number.

voicemail

Your network stores the voicemail messages you receive. When you **receive** a voicemail message, your phone shows the voicemail message indicator **2***1.

Note: Your service provider may include additional information about using this feature.

Select Listen Now by pressing the center of the Directional Key (() (OK) to dial voicemail.

or

Use the Directional Key (\bigcirc) to scroll to **Listen Later**, then press the center of the Directional Key (\bigcirc) (**OK**).

The voicemail message indicator (2") appears on the bottom of the screen until you listen to your message or until you go to Messaging > Voicemail and press the Left Soft Key (Clear).





download ringtone for an entry

You can download a ringtone to assign to a **Contacts** entry. When you receive a call from that entry, your phone plays the ringtone you assigned.

- 1 From the main screen, press the Right Soft Key (Contacts) to open the CONTACT LIST.
- 2 Use the Directional Key () to scroll to the entry and press the Left Soft Key (Edit).
- 3 Scroll to Ringtone and press the Left Soft Key (Set) to go to the CALL RINGTONE menu.

Select Get New Applications and proceed to download and save a ringtone.

add entries to group

To send a text message to many people at once, you can create a group and add contact entries to it.

voice recognition

Your phone's voice recognition feature lets you make calls and complete other actions by speaking commands to your phone.

voice recognition tips

- When speaking the name of a Contacts entry, say
 the name exactly as it is listed. For example, to
 call the mobile number for an entry named Bill
 Smith, say "Call Bill Smith mobile." (If the entry
 includes only one number for Bill Smith, say
 "Call Bill Smith.")
 - Speak numbers at a normal speed and volume, and pronounce each digit distinctly. Avoid pausing between digits.

 You can set your phone to play voice command instructions through the speakerphone by pressing the Voice Command Key, which opens the VOICE COMMANDS menu. If you use the Call command to place a call, audio plays through the phone's earpiece when the call connects. You can turn this feature off (see page 100).

Access the menu or perform the action you specify from a list shown on the phone.

Look up a Contacts entry by saying the contact name.

Redial

Redial the last number dialed.

Play <Playlist>

voice recognition settings

To modify voice recognition settings:

1 With the phone flip closed, press and hold the Voice Command Key on the right side of the phone.

With the **phone flip open**, press and release the Voice Command Key (see page 3). (Pressing and holding the key activates voice recording.)

Your phone says **Please say a command** and displays a list of voice commands.

2 Press the Right Soft Key (Settings).

3 Use the Directional Key () to scroll to the desired option and press the center of the Directional Key () (0K).

voice recognition settings

Confirmation

If your phone is not sure that it has correctly identified a name or number that you speak, it can display up to three choices and prompt you to confirm the correct one.

You can control when choice lists appear:

Automatic—Display a list of choices from multiple alternatives.

Always Confirm—Always display a list of choices when there are multiple alternatives.

Never Confirm—Never display a choice list. The phone chooses from the best alternatives.

voice recognition settings

Sensitivity

You can fine tune your phone's ability to recognize voice commands. Select Most Sensitive, Recommended, or Least Sensitive.

If sensitivity is too strict, your phone often rejects voice commands and displays "Please repeat..." or "No match found." Select Most Sensitive.

If sensitivity is too forgiving, you experience false activations (indicating that the phone detects a wrong match). Select Least Sensitive.

Adaptation

Follow the prompts on your screen to improve recognition of spoken words. Adaptation takes about sixty seconds and requires you to be in a quiet place (no background noise).

voice recognition settings

Prompts

Mode—Set whether your phone says **Prompts**, **Readout** (to read every word on the screen), or **Tones Only**.

Audio Playback—Set how you want to hear prompts.

To access in-device help for a setting you speak, press the Left Soft Key (Info).

- 6 Select On, and set the alarm time, recurrence, and alert sound by scrolling to the category and pressing the center of the Directional Key () (SET).



Specific Absorption Rate (IEEE)

Your model wireless phone meets the governmental requirements for exposure to radio waves.

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed and manufactured to not exceed limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) of the U.S. Government and by the Canadian regulatory authorities. These limits are part of comprehensive guidelines and establish permitted levels of RF energy for the general population. The guidelines are based on standards that were developed by independent scientific organizations through periodic and thorough evaluation of scientific studies. The standards include a substantial safety margin designed for the safety of all persons, regardless of age or health, and to account for any variations in measurements.

The exposure standard for mobile devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate (SAR). The IEEE SAR limit set by the FCC and but the Canadian regulatory authorities is 1.6 watts per kilogram (W/kg), averaged over one gram of tissue. Tests for SAR are conducted using procedures accepted

by the FCC and by Industry Canada with the mobile device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequencies. Although the SAR is determined at the highest certified power level, the actual SAR level of the mobile device while operating can be below the maximum value. This is because the mobile device is designed to operate at multiple power levels so as to use only the power required to reach the network. In general, the closer you are to a wireless base station, the lower the power output.

Before a mobile device is available for sale to the public in the U.S. and Canada, it must be tested and certified to the FCC and Industry Canada that it does not exceed the limit established by each government for safe exposure. Body-worn measurements can differ, depending upon available accessories and regulatory requirements. The SAR information includes the Motorola testing protocol, assessment procedure, and measurement uncertainty range for this product.

While there may be differences between the SAR levels of various mobile devices and at various positions, they meet the governmental requirements for safe exposure.
